Studying in a foreign country

These abilities are helpful in every part of your life and make you a better person.

Exchange students are very highly seen in our society. "When you finish your study abroad program and return home, you will return with a new perspective on culture, language skills, a great education, and a willingness to learn... all of these are very attractive to future employers." (10 Benefits) The abilities exchange students gain during their exchange year are useful in every kind of employment. From my personal experience, people see exchange students as very brave and they often are amazed by their decision to live in a foreign country for one year.
